Discussion/Action—Permit for Amplifying Device in Doyle Park

Director Flick reported the Parks Department has accepted a rental for the Cheese Fest shelter at Doyle Park for a wedding reception. The renter, Ashley Hietpas, appeared requesting to play amplified music past the allowed Village ordinance of 10:00 PM. All requests for amplified music past 10:00 PM must be approved by the Village Board per Section 30-27(g) (3). Director Flick is only aware of two past approvals for amplified music to be played past 10:00 PM in the park and they were for Cheese Fest and Rock Cancer. The Parks Department does not support granting this request for the following reasons:

1. Location of the event is in close proximity to residential dwelling units.
2. Parks close at 11:00 PM; rented amenities for events such as a wedding reception need separation of event activities in order for patrons to be out of the park by 11:00 PM.
3. No current criteria for determining types of amplified music that could be played past 10:00 PM that is appropriate for the venue and park.
4. If approved, the Village has set precedence for future requests.

Discussion/Action—Resolution #6 Amending Resolution No. 1, Series 2001 Regarding Polling Sites For Elections at Village Hall

Clerk Decker reported that Pursuant to past history for minor local elections, the Village of Little Chute has historically combined the polling locations of the Civic Center and Village Hall into one polling location at Village Hall. There were 559 voters in the last Spring Election in 2014. Combining the polling places into one location would facilitate greater efficiency amongst the poll workers and save money. The change will only be in effect for the April 7, 2015 election.

EXPLANATION: On the upper roof, (Fire Dept.) remove existing stone ballast and membrane. Inspect/replace damaged or deteriorated insulation per bid unit price. Install mechanically fastened cover board over existing EPS insulation. Install fully adhered 60 mil EPDM membrane. Flash all projections, walls and perimeter edge. Install Pac Clad metal edge.

On lower roof, (Police Dept.) remove existing stone ballast and membrane. Inspect/replace damaged or deteriorated insulation per bid unit price. Install cover board over existing EPS insulation. Install new loose laid EPDM membrane and new stone ballast. Flash all projections, walls and perimeter edge. Install Pac Clad metal edge.

This ballast roof system is recommended for the Police side due to the probability of damage to power, data and communication lines with fasteners needed to hold down existing insulation and cover board with a fully adhered system. These conduit pipes are fastened to the underside of the metal deck. Also there are no mechanicals on this roof which greatly reduces activity on roof.

After reviewing the bids the low responsible bidder for this project is Marianne's Roofing for \$51,470.00 plus unit price for any replacement of insulation. Reference checks were requested and came back positive. For further information, the bid tab is attached.

RECOMMENDATION: Based on information received I would recommend awarding the project to Marianne's Roofing as did McMahon Associates, Inc.
