It is the goal of the Village of Little Chute to continue televising and inspection every sewer main and laterals in areas identified for major street reconstruction/rehabilitation work. During street construction, we are replacing manhole frames and covers to ensure tight fits and as well as installing an internal chimney boot to seal out ground water and eliminate I&I entry points. The Village continues to explore viable options to address I&I problems in the mains but also I&I associated with private laterals. The Public Works Department will continue to perform sewer cleaning, manhole inspections and maintenance on 25% of the sewer system each year.

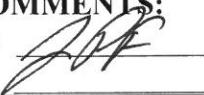

EXPLANATION: The Village received a claim filed on 8/6/2015. Ms. Guyette claims her vehicle was damaged by a fallen Village tree limb.

The Village's insurance claims administrator, Statewide Services, Inc. has investigated the claim and has recommended that the Village of Little Chute deny this claim pursuant to the Wisconsin statute for disallowance of claim 893.80(1g). The denial is based on the fact that the investigation revealed no negligence on behalf of the Village. The Village did not have prior actual or constructive notice of the tree condition which allegedly caused this accident.

Copies of a letter that will be sent to Ms. Guyette and a letter sent to the Village from Statewide Services regarding this claim are attached.

RECOMMENDATION: Review and affirm decision of the Village's Insurance Claims Administrator, Statewide Services, Inc. to deny the claim filed by Ms. Guyette, Claim #WM000441460138.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Agreement is between Walgreen Co. ("Walgreens"), a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois and registered and authorized to conduct business in the State of Wisconsin, and the Village of Little Chute, Wisconsin (the "Village"), a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

1. Definitions. In this Agreement:

(a) The "Property" means the land and improvements located at 219 West Main Street, within the Village of Little Chute, Wisconsin.

(b) A "tax year" means a year in which an assessment is made as of January 1, with taxes based on the assessment payable in the year following the tax year.

(c) "Case" means the action pending in Outagamie County Circuit Court titled *Walgreen Co. v. Village of Little Chute*, Case No. 2015-CV-708.

2. Refund of Taxes. The Village shall issue a refund payable to Reinhart Boerner Van Deuren S.C. Trust Account, or to another account designated by Walgreens in writing, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 74.37, in the amount of \$11,923.65 as a refund of property taxes previously paid by Walgreens based on the property tax assessment of the Property for the 2014 tax year. The parties agree that no portion of this amount constitutes interest.

3. Waiver of Costs. Each party waives all claims for costs.

4. Time of Payments. The Village shall pay the refund of taxes provided in section 2 of this Agreement in full within 30 days of the date this Agreement is signed by both parties.

5. Stipulation for Dismissal. No later than ten days after Walgreens receives payment in full of the refund of taxes provided in Section 2 of this Agreement, the parties shall enter into a stipulation for dismissal of the Case and file the stipulation with the Outagamie County Circuit Court.

6. Responsibility for Fees and Expenses of Attorneys and Experts. Each party shall be solely responsible for the fees of its attorneys and experts.

7. No Representations. Each party acknowledges and agrees that no representation or promise not expressly contained in this Agreement has been made by the opposing party or any of its employees, attorneys, agents, or representatives. Each party acknowledges that it is not entering into this Agreement on the basis of any such representation or promise, express or implied.

8. Binding on Successors. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each of the parties and their respective heirs, successors, and assigns.

9. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

10. Interpretation of Agreement. The parties acknowledge that this Agreement is the

product of joint negotiations. If any dispute arises concerning the interpretation of this Agreement: (a) neither party shall be deemed the drafter of this Agreement for purposes of its interpretation; and (b) the parties shall attempt in good faith to resolve the dispute.

11. Representation By Counsel; Reliance. Each party acknowledges that it has been represented throughout all negotiations leading up to this Agreement by attorneys of its choice and that its attorneys have approved this Agreement. Each party represents that in entering into this Agreement, the party has relied on its own judgment and on the advice of its attorneys, and that no statements or representations made by the other party or any of its agents, except statements or representations expressly made in this Agreement, have influenced or induced the party to sign this Agreement.

12. No Assignment or Transfer. Walgreens represents and warrants that it has not assigned or transferred to anyone and will not assign or transfer to anyone the claim Walgreen served on the Village with respect to the 2014 assessment of the Property.

13. Entire Agreement. This Agreement states and constitutes the entire agreement of the parties concerning its subject matter and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements (written or oral), representations, negotiations, and discussions concerning its subject matter.

14. No Admissions of Liability or Concerning Assessments or Fair Market Value. This Agreement is the settlement of disputed claims. By entering into this Agreement, the Village does not admit any liability to Walgreens for any of the claims asserted in the Case or Walgreens' objections to the assessments, and the payments made under this Agreement shall not be construed as an admission of any such liability. Neither Party makes an admission about the assessments or the fair market value of the Property as January 1, 2014 January 1, 2015 or any other date nor any other admission concerning the assessment of Walgreens' property. In addition, none of the agreed upon values or assessments as of January 1, 2014 and January 1, 2015 shall be admissible in any proceeding or assessment challenge in any subsequent year.

15. Waiver. No waiver of any breach of this Agreement shall be deemed a continuing waiver of that breach or a waiver of any other breach of this Agreement.

16. Amendments or Modifications. This Agreement may not be amended, modified or altered in any manner whatsoever, except by a further written agreement duly authorized and signed by the parties.

17. Authorization to Sign Agreement. Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party represents and warrants that the person holds the position indicated beneath the person's signature and that the person has the requisite corporate or other authority to sign this Agreement on behalf of the party. Each party represents that entry into this Agreement is not in contravention of any agreement or undertaking to which the party is bound.

18. Reading of Agreement. Each person signing this Agreement on behalf of either party acknowledges that the person has read this Agreement, that the person understands the terms and conditions of this Agreement, that the person (if other than an attorney for the party) has been advised by legal counsel concerning this Agreement, and that the person freely and voluntarily signs this Agreement.
