Presentation—Legion Park Presentation by the Little Chute Diamond Club

John Elrick with the Little Chute Diamond Club thanked the board for taking time to hear their presentation on making improvements to Legion Park. They are looking to re-invest resources they have earned to keep Legion Park a sought after venue for non-club type youth baseball and softball tournaments. For years now, they have received compliments from teams as far away as Chicago, IL and the northern Michigan areas about the facilities and how well the tournaments are run. He stated continuous improvements are necessary to maintain the desire for teams to want to come to Little Chute. It is their opinion that they can accomplish that by moving the 3rd field to the north and west as well as turning it slightly. They will be raising funds to procure a 4th field, lights for the remaining three fields, and a new concession stand. In summary, the Little Chute Diamond Club is looking for approval from the Board to enter an agreement with the school district to allow installation of a permanent fence on a portion of the District's property. Additionally, they are asking for permission to move the 3rd diamond this fall. Approval was given to work with the school district and have a formal action item on the September 2nd agenda.




